

# What is a Medicare Quality Innovation Network – Quality Improvement Organization (QIN QIO)?

A group of health quality experts, clinicians, and consumers organized to improve the quality of care delivered to people with Medicare. There are currently 12 QIN-QIOs in the current contract. This five-year award cycle runs through 2024. QIN-QIOs are not limited to holding one contract. Many also work in arenas, such as End Stage Renal Disease, Medicaid External Quality Review, and have grants with Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ), Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and state-level Medicaid and public health department grants.

## What Does a Medicare QIN-QIO Do?

Health care quality is our overarching goal. Our data-driven initiatives bring stakeholders together at the local, community and tribal levels to:

- Act as a convener and facilitator within communities to address health care concerns
- Act as a steward of data for quality measures
- Provide technical assistance to health care providers and communities
- Conduct education and training on various topics and across care settings
- Implement evidence-based quality improvement tools and processes (i.e., TeamSTEPPS® and Lean Six Sigma)
