Capacity Building


Increases access to health care for people in rural communities through grant programs and public partnerships

Advises the HHS Secretary on policy and regulation that affect rural areas



Medicare Beneficiary Quality Improvement Project

- Medicare Rural Hospital Flexibility (Flex) Grant is an investment of over \$28 million that supports CAH
 efforts in quality and performance/financial improvement. FORHP supports quality improvement
 across the 45 states participating in Flex through the Medicare Beneficiaries Quality Improvement
 Program (MBQIP).
- FORHP requires MBQIP participation through measure reporting. CAHs report MBQIP core measures
 that align with other Federal reporting requirements (antibiotic stewardship measure is one of the
 MBQIP core measures).
- MBQIP works with over 1,300 CAHs to support quality measurement and improvement in the areas of
 patient safety/inpatient care, outpatient care, patient engagement and experience, and care
 transitions. In 2022, FORHP begun the process of expanding measures that are rural-relevant


